<p><b>Pre-induction Task: Part 2</b></p> <p><b>Engage:</b> Search <b>IN THE NEWS</b>. Find and print out a recent news article (from the last month) that depicts, what you believe to be, an inequality/injustice in society. This could be in the UK or elsewhere in the world e.g. war, politics, pay gaps, education, poverty, colonialism, racism, sexism, matter regarding LGBTQ communities etc.</p> <p><b>Challenge:</b> Write an analytic review which addresses the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Outline the injustice</li> <li>2. What evidence is there that this is an injustice</li> <li>3. How/Why has this come about?</li> <li>4. What are the impacts on those involved?</li> <li>5. Who is to be held responsible?</li> <li>6. How might the situation be resolved?</li> </ol>	<p>Keeping up to date with <b>current affairs</b> and looking for sociological debates within them, will help you <b>apply current debates</b> to your answers in examinations (AO2 - application skills). This will also help you to discuss <b>the relevance of sociology today</b> (AO3 – analysis/evaluation skills), and may <b>encourage your interests</b> after your 6<sup>th</sup> form studies</p>	<p>You should complete both the engage and challenge tasks and be prepared to show and discuss this in your first week in Y12</p>
